## HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT

The School Standards and Framework Act of 1998 requires schools to adopt a Home School Agreement, and the Governing Body has adopted this Agreement

### The School's Expectations of the Child

The children themselves developed a set of rules to follow in school, known as the 'Behaviour Bees'. All children are expected to follow these. They are:



(Treat people how you would like to be treated)



(Always speak to people in a polite way)



(Tell the truth and learn from your mistakes)



(Never hurt people and tell someone if you feel worried or unsafe)



(Listen carefully and work hard in every lesson)

## **The School's Expectations of the Parents**

As parents and family we will do our best to:

- Ensure that our/my child's attendance at school is regular and punctual.
- Support our/my child in his/her home learning, regularly hear him/her read and ensure when homework is set it is completed promptly and to the best possible standard.
- Attend school events and meetings to celebrate our/my child's achievements.
- Inform the school about any concerns or problems that might affect our child's work or behaviour.
- Inform the school on the first day of absence and provide a written explanation for absence upon his/her return.
- Ensure our/my child is properly equipped for school.
- Support the school's policies and guidelines on uniform and behaviour.

We agree that we will not use social networking sites to post complaints / concerns about the school, refer to children or members of school staff by name or post photos of children or school staff.

## **Parents' Expectations of the School**

As a school we will do our best to:

- Create a caring, safe and stimulating learning environment.
- Ensure your child receives his/her entitlement to a broad and balanced education fulfilling the requirements of the National Curriculum.
- Inform you of the progress of your child and tell you promptly about any problems with your child's work or behaviour.
- Provide regular opportunities for parents to communicate with the school.

## Parents' and School's Expectations of Pupils

As pupils we will do our best to:

- Follow the school behaviour bees.
- Attend school regularly and on time aiming for 97% + attendance each year.
- Wear my uniform with pride and be of smart at all times.
- Take care of the school environment.
- Be a responsible member of the Mill Rythe Family.

## E-Safety: Acceptable Use Policy

We also have a set of rules that children should follow to help ensure that they use technology safely. These are:

- I will log on using my own username and password.
- If I find anything or anyone online that makes me feel uncomfortable, unsafe or uneasy in any way, I will tell an adult immediately.
- I will make sure that all online contact with other children and adults is responsible, polite and sensible.
- I will only upload or add images, video, sounds or text that are appropriate, kind and truthful and will not possibly upset someone.
- I will keep my personal details such as name, phone number or address private when I'm online.
- I know that my behaviour online can be checked and my parent/ carer contacted if a member of school staff is concerned.
- I will be responsible for the way I behave online, because I know that these rules are to keep me safe.
