In addition to this we ask that pupils read five times a week and that they complete their Star Reading Journals. Please can you sign in the 'reading regularly' chart when your child has read **20 minutes** a day (two boxes—no more please even if your child has read for longer). Reading journals need to be **handed in every Monday**.

We will give out times tables homework weekly on Fridays and it needs to be handed in on Friday the following week.

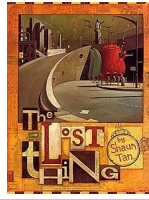
Pencil Cases

English

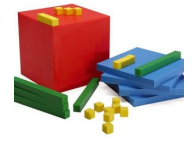
This term our English curriculum will be linked to the book 'The Lost Thing'. We will be covering the skills of diary writing and information leaflets.



Maths

The key areas for this half term will be:

- Number and place value

- Reasoning and problem solving skills



Design Technology : Structures

Physical Education Games

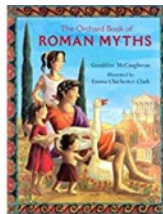
