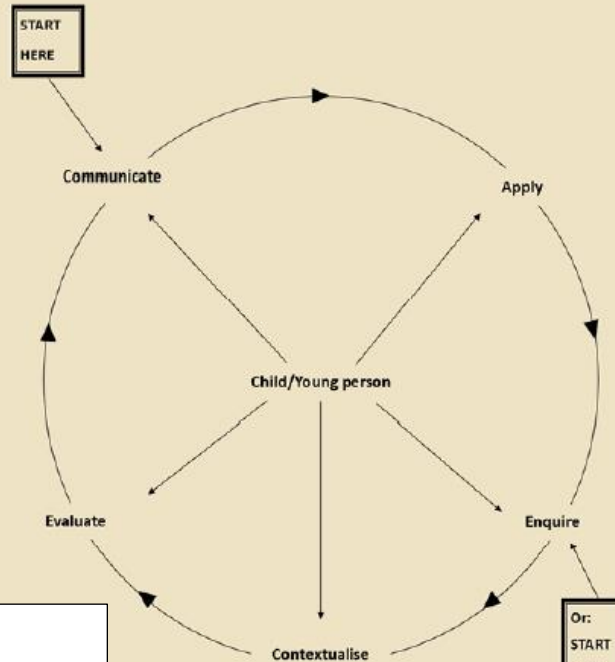
What images can you see in these pictures?

Everyone processes information and sees things differently.

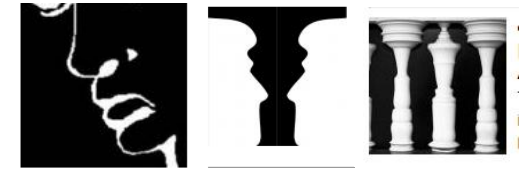


Do you see the dress as blue or gold?
