

What does Britain do to honour Remembrance Day?

- Wear poppies
- On the Sunday nearest to 11 November at 11am each year, a Remembrance Service is held at the Cenotaph
- At 11am on each Remembrance Sunday a two minute silence is observed at war memorials and other public spaces across the UK
- Art and poetry also commemorate the First World War, notably the most famous poem: In Flanders Fields, by John McCrae. He was a surgeon in the Canadian army. He wrote the poem whilst observing the scenes outside a dressing station near Ypres in 1915.

What happens at a Christian funeral?

- 1) Everyone will gather before the funeral party arrives
- 2) The funeral party carry the coffin inside the church up the aisle.
- 3) Everyone will stand as a sign of respect
- 4) Prayers will be read
- 5) Hymns will be sung
- 6) Stories will be shared about the person, particularly good memories and happy times.
- 7) Bible readings will be read sharing what God has said about life and death.
- 8) They will ask for God's peace
- 9) Christians believe death is not the end so people bring their thoughts and feelings to God and receive messages from the Bible that give them hope and reminds them that God loves them as well as the person who has died.

How do people react to death? How do they feel? How can we help? How do Christians' deal with Jesus's death? Why does it make them not too sad? Jesus died for everyone's sins, so that people could be forgiven. He was resurrected.

Remembrance: The act of remembering something

Everyone has events that are important to remember for them so no act of remembrance is incorrect. For example, some people may not see a dead leaf as important to remember but think about its journey from bud to death and think about the symbolism that the leaf to the tree's children then it could be important to remember. There are positive and negative events that need to be remembered in the world:

Positive:- births, weddings, Christmas

Negative:- Twin Towers, Grenfell, World Wars
