Once inside, we were given an interesting talk about all the features we could see in the church, followed by a chance to explore the building itself. For many of us, it was the first time we had been in a church and we saw stained glass windows, the ancient font for baptising people, the altar and much more. We are very grateful to Jenny for her information and welcome to the church, and to the children who behaved impeccably.

On Thursday, Year 6 took part in Ancient Greek Day! We began the day with some food tasting: we tried Greek yoghurt and honey, hummus, tzatziki, olives, feta cheese and pita bread. Needless to say, there were lots of us who only liked the bread! We learnt about the Ancient Greek Olympics and designed Greek pots depicting an event. We had fun tea-staining the paper to make it look old. Finally, we had the Greek theatre come in and we acted out scenes from Ancient Greek daily life, including school, the market and homelife. We then acted out some Greek myths which was really funny – we particularly enjoyed the myth about the Cyclops.
