The children enjoyed taking part in a dance inspired by the Hindu story of Diwali-Rama and Sita, listening to extracts of the Qu'ran in Arabic, trying on different items of symbolic clothing, listening to Christian music and stories from across all the faiths and some children took part in a meditation activity at the end of the Buddhist workshop.

They all enjoyed the day and were given an introduction into the wider community and beliefs and traditions that they live alongside. The message of the day was that we are all people under the same sky and should value each other for our differences.
