## **Year 5 Rivers Trip**

On Monday, Year 5 visited Fishbourne River and Dell Quay. It was an exciting trip where the children got to see erosion and deposition from first-hand experience, measuring the depth and width of the river themselves. They enjoyed sketching the river and labelling the features whilst being out in the field not to mention a quick game of Pooh sticks where a discussion of river speed occurred. They also created their own river sculptures from sand and learnt how reed beds indicate the mouth of the river. We had a very fun, muddy day where the sun shone and enjoyed our transportation being on the top of a double decker bus.

#### Year 3 Fishbourne Roman Palace

This week, Year 3's went on a fantastic trip to Fishbourne Roman Palace to conclude our jampacked history topic this half term on the Romans. It was a fantastic day where we looked around the museum and saw so many amazing artefacts and walked around the remains of the palace. We were even lucky enough to take part in a workshop where we played Roman games, made yarn, milled flour in a Roman kitchen and learned how to write in the Roman alphabet. The children also really impressed their teachers with all of their knowledge!

#### Year 4 Butser Trip

On Friday, Year 4 visited Butser Ancient Farm as part of their History topics on the Saxons and Vikings. We were entertained with the story of Beowulf as we sat around the fire in the Saxon hall and had a question and answer session. We had the opportunity to act like archaeologists by digging for artefacts in pits and made our own copper jewellery.

Throughout the day, the children were complimented on their behaviour and enthusiasm for the subject, and they demonstrated a great deal of understanding of the time periods. It was a fantastic way to round of our learning and was thoroughly enjoyed by all. We would like to thank all of our parent helpers, without whom we would not have been able to go.
